
NEW SIGNAGE & WEBSITE



PARLIAMENTARY UPDATES

In February the Chief Minister delivered her plan for a year of action, preceding the passage of payroll tax relief legislation, and the repeal of laws governing minimum unit pricing for alcohol. A ministerial report was delivered to provide an update on NT corrections, and thereafter an urgent bill on correctional services debated and passed, to provide extra staff for prisons. The sittings concluded with a recognition of the 17th anniversary of the national apology to Australia's Indigenous peoples.

In March the Parliament recognised the profound public service of two recently departed Territorians, the Hon Austin Asche AC KC, and Grant Tambling AM. The ICAC Operation Apollo Investigation Report (regarding senior police recruitment) was tabled, as were reports by the Legislative Scrutiny Committee regarding bill inquiries. The most contentious agenda item, the Territory Coordinator Bill, was passed following thorough consideration in detail. Bills to amend the Local Government Act 2019, the Water Act 1992, the Aboriginal Sacred Sites Act 1989, and repeal the Portable Long Service Leave Act 2024, were introduced. Ministerial reports on Asian relations, public housing reform, and the Federal Budget were discussed, and an independent motion passed regarding the Aboriginal Justice Agreement. Other legislation passed included a police administration bill, an education bill (to enshrine school attendance officers), a bill to remove third party merits review (for petroleum, planning and water decisions), and a bill to repeal the \$15B debt ceiling. Significant debates were also held regarding investment in education, investment in healthcare, and economic development and infrastructure programs.

DAMA III - NEW MIGRATION AGREEMENT


A third Designated Area Migration Agreement was secured for the NT in March. It covers 325 occupations (up from 135 previously) and will allow up to 1500 approved nominations per year for overseas workers (an increase from 625). Whilst investing in upskilling Australians is always our first priority, well targeted migration complements local skills while contributing to productivity growth. DAMA III will assist local businesses to access skilled workforce and I'm proud to have played a part in it being delivered for Territorians.

STUART PARK HIGH STREET - DRAFT PLANS







Traffic management will be the initial focus, to make the promenade safer, parking easier, and frequenting the area more desirable. Using the existing parameters of the *NT Planning Scheme* 2020, we then hope to gradually develop gateway locations, improved buildings, laneway accesses, active street frontages, and balanced options for commercial and residential mixed-used development.



I am driving this initiative because it represents one of the best ready-to-go areas of Darwin with scope for high return on investment for the Territory, and support for CBD growth. Rest assured, public consultation on any suggested changes will be thorough – we are just beginning to consider ideas and there will be ample opportunity to have your say.

SCHOOL BUS ROUTES - DELIVERED

I'm pleased to have resolved the issue of the absence of any school buses for kids in Berrimah Northcrest. Revised routes 100 and 206 now operate from Reuben Avenue, connecting the area to a dozen schools in the northern suburbs, Nightcliff and the city. Likewise, Route 464 has been expanded to cover Tipperary Waters and Dinah Beach Road northwards, to help students at Stuart Park Primary School with their travel.



EAST ARM - DEFENCE WEEK

NT Defence Week showcases the vital role of the Territory in supporting national security. It was launched at an East Arm marine logistics business currently servicing our defence sector. It's critical that we continue to lobby the Federal Government to maintain defence industries in the Territory – defence investment produces a disproportionately large economic multiplier effect for our local economy.
