


#### **Absence and Late Procedures**

Please always remember to notify us if your child is not coming to school. This can be done by ringing the office on 89977333 or by emailing: **stuartpark.school@education.nt.gov.au** 

If your child will be absent due to illness for more than 3 days, we may request a medical certificate for their absence. For planned absences longer than 2 weeks, we require families to send an email detailing the reason for the absence and the dates they will be away.

It is very important that your child arrives on time to school but if they do arrive late, please ensure they go to the office to collect a yellow card so that the class roll can reflect that they have arrived.



#### **School Drop Off and Pick Up**

- -Supervision on school grounds begins in the morning at **7:50am**. Please refrain from dropping children off prior to this time.
- -The undercover Bree Stop may be used for kiss and drop in the morning. This zone operates under the same conditions as 'No Parking' zones. You may only stop in this area for up to 2 minutes to drop off or pick up children. The driver may not leave the vehicle unattended. Please also refrain from using the staff car park.
- Please be considerate and careful when parking around our school keeping in mind our residential neighbour's driveway access points and lawns. The Council parking inspectors regularly attend and ticket cars parked illegally.

-If you are picking your child up from the Bree Stop after school, please wait until **after 2:40pm** to drive through as this gives us time to load our buses and see them off.



#### **Mobile Phone Reminder**

If your child brings a mobile phone to school it needs to be stored in the office during the school day and collected at 2:30pm. NT Education policy states that Students in preschool to year 6 will not be permitted to have mobile phones in their possession during the school day and smart watches must be switched to flight mode.


