


From the Principal...

NAPLAN Testing Period

The NAPLAN testing period is fast approaching for our Year 3 and 5 students. The testing will begin on Wednesday, 12th March (Week 7) and will run through to Wednesday, 19th March (Week 8). Please note that most days will have two tests – one before recess and one after recess. However, on Wednesday, 12th March and Friday, 14th March, there will only be one test before recess.

Our teachers have worked diligently to prepare the students for these assessments, ensuring they are well-equipped and confident. NAPLAN is a valuable opportunity to gain insights into students' progress in key areas such as Mathematics, Reading, Writing, Spelling, and Grammar. While the tests are a one-off, they provide important information to help guide our future teaching. To support our students, we kindly ask for your help in ensuring they are well-rested and arrive at school on time during the testing period.

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Looking Ahead


I would like to take this opportunity to invite all parents and carers to the Annual General Meeting (AGM) on **Monday, 10th March** in the school Library at 5:30pm.

Fun Fridays in Year 2 Tracey: Learning Through PLAY






