NAPLAN Results

NAPLAN results have now been sent home with students. These results provide a snapshot of your child's progress in literacy and numeracy and are one of the many tools we use to understand student achievement. If you have questions or would like to discuss your child's results in more detail, please do get in touch with your child's teacher. Remember, NAPLAN is just one piece of the puzzle — your child's effort, attitude and growth across the year are equally important.

Professional Learning – Pupil Free Day

On last week's pupil-free day, all teaching and support staff engaged in a full day of professional learning alongside our colleagues from Moil and Nightcliff Primary Schools, and the NT School of Music. The focus of the day was the Science of Learning and Explicit Instruction. Together, we explored the use of Daily Reviews, Engagement Norms, and practices that build strong, consistent instructional routines across classrooms.

This professional learning aligns with our shared commitment to ensure that teaching at our school is effective, consistent, and responsive- and that every student benefits from high-quality, evidence-informed instruction.

Over the coming weeks, you may notice some new strategies being trialled in Maths lessons, such as daily reviews and structured engagement routines. These practices are designed to help students retain knowledge, participate more actively, and feel more confident in their learning.

Tree Update – Early Childhood Area

You may have noticed that a large tree was recently removed from the Early Childhood area. This decision was not taken lightly. The tree was unfortunately assessed by a qualified arborist as very high risk, posing an immediate danger to the safety of children, staff, and families. The arborist identified extensive internal structural damage—possibly caused by lightning—and recommended urgent removal.

We are now working through the remainder of the arborist's report. The other trees identified in the assessment carry lower levels of risk and may require pruning or treatment, rather than removal.

At Stuart Park, we value our trees for the shade and natural play opportunities they provide. We only remove trees when they pose a significant risk to our school community. All decisions regarding tree removal are approved not only by our School Council, but also by the Department of Infrastructure.

Attendance and Engagement

We know that consistent attendance has a direct impact on student achievement and wellbeing. We're pleased to see strong attendance across the school, and we appreciate your support in getting students to school on time, every day. 
Open Door Policy

Term 3 Book Club

Your child brought home a book club catalogue last week. Orders are due back no later than Wednesday, July 30th. The school receives award points on all orders which allows us to purchase resources for the school and our library.

You can order and pay online on the "LOOP," which stands for Linked Online Ordering & Payments. Go to: LOGIN (scholastic.com.au) then either **Log in or Register** to create an account. or https://www.scholastic.com.au/book-club/book-club-home/ select Book Club, then Book Club Parents in the drop down menu.

- Add your child's first name and last initial (so the school knows who the book is for)
- Enter the item number from the Book Club catalogue.
- You can order for multiple children at once if they attend the same school
- All orders are linked directly to the school for submission to Scholastic. Books will be delivered to your child's classroom if you order by the close date.

You may also still order the old fashion way by sending orders to school with cash. Please make sure order forms are filled out correctly with the student's name and class and placed in an envelope or small bag with the cash. Please don't sticky tape money to the order form as this makes it very difficult to read.

If you would like the items to be a surprise, there is a GIFT function when you order online. The Gift Function enables you to tag Book Club orders on LOOP that are intended as a surprise gift. LOOP orders tagged as a gift will be delivered to school and marked accordingly, for the Book Club Organiser to set aside at the school office for you to collect. 
Bookclub orders close on Wednesday, July 30!



To start Term 3, in 5LK we've been focusing on the power of **gratitude** – understanding what it is and why it's important.




