








PARLIAMENTARY UPDATES

In May the Legislative Assembly sat for a fortnight, with activity centred around the release of the Treasurer's first budget. Revenue and Appropriation Bills were debated over several days, and laws also passed regarding Portable Long Service Leave, Aboriginal Sacred Sites, Domestic and Family Violence, Water Reserves, Local Government, and assorted Attorney General matters. In response to a motion on Voluntary Assisted Dying, the Government initiated an inquiry to progress the issue for Territorians. Motions were also debated on Gambling Harms, and Eradicating Racism. The fortnight was followed by two weeks of Budget Estimates hearings in June, during which Ministers and their government agencies were questioned and the Budget examined in detail. Revenue and Appropriation Bills were passed thereafter on June 19.

July sittings began with Ministerial Reports and associated debates on law and order, and the findings of multiple coronial inquests. Laws were debated and passed regarding Public Information, Racing and Wagering, Youth Justice, and Defamation, and several more bills introduced. Motions were debated on undergrounding power in the Northern Suburbs, plus Family, Domestic, and Sexual Violence. A petition opposing the Berrimah Road duplication was tabled by myself, debated and the matter resolved in favour of the petitioners.



In September a Ministerial Report was delivered to mark the first anniversary of the Government, reporting on twelve months of Reducing Crime, Rebuilding the Economy, and Restoring the Territory Lifestyle. A Ministerial Report regarding Silkwood and the expansion of Litchfield National Park also featured. Legislation passed included bills concerning Animal Protection, Transport, the Community Benefit Fund, and the creation of Police Public Safety Officers. A motion was debated on Climate Change Adaptation and Mitigation for the NT, and notably for the first time in years, although amended by the Government was passed by the chamber on the voices without a division vote!

FANFARE FESTIVAL 2025!









I'm delighted to report the inaugural Fong Lim FANFARE Festival was a great artistic and economic success! Over July 4-6 we delivered three awesome events centred around the visiting 21-piece big band Dr V's Swing Thing, entertaining, commemorating, and educating. On Friday 4th we began with a glamorous Swing, Swing, Swing! Dinner Dance at Dinah Beach, with a sold-out crowd dressing up to dine and dance the night away. That was followed on Saturday 5th at Government House with a special outdoor Jazz on the Terrace concert hosted by the Administrator, recognising the contributions of hundreds of community musical volunteers. Finally, on Sunday 6th we put on Dave Theak's Jazz Jamboree, an interactive school holiday performance masterclass aimed at inspiring our next generation of young musicians.

Thank you to partners from the Commonwealth Parliamentary Association, the University of Sydney Conservatorium of Music, Sydney Grammar School, Dinah Beach Cruising Yacht Association, Haileybury Rendall School, NT Music School, American Australian Association, and Government House for helping to make FANFARE happen. I'm looking forward to making the festival even bigger and better in 2026, involving local wind bands, brass bands, and big bands to put on gigs through more of Fong Lim's hidden gem locations!

ROAD REPAIRS & TRAFFIC IMPROVEMENT

I'm happy to report that I've managed to fix several street infrastructure issues in the electorate. The Charles Street Stuart Park sinkage and depression problem has been fully addressed and completed. New kerbs, concreting, stormwater drains, and sidewalks have been built next to the childcare centre and there should be no more pedestrian or vehicle safety worries. Likewise, the Berrimah Road Duplication has been resolved – a petition to Parliament and campaigning has successfully stopped the ill-conceived project, which was going to cost a fortune and cause significant unnecessary damage and disruption to local businesses and Haileybury Rendall School. The Narrows Bagot Road Traffic Survey has also been recently completed – I am awaiting the results from the Department to help guide next steps on how to make the intersection safer. With Darwin City Council elections finalised, I will next be tackling the upgrade of Dinah Beach Road.

VOLUNTARY ASSISTED DYING INQUIRY

Over the last four months, at the direction of the Attorney General, I have led the Legal and Constitutional Affairs Committee (LCAC) Parliamentary Inquiry into Voluntary Assisted Dying (VAD). This is a highly complex issue that many Territorians care deeply about. Together with LCAC members, I have worked hard to address the terms of reference provided to us, producing a Consultation Paper, two Interim Reports, and collecting evidence across the entire Territory (particularly in remote areas). All of this will contribute towards a forthcoming Final Report, which will include full drafting instructions for model legislation to workably enable VAD in this jurisdiction.
